


Figure 4.3. Jan van de Velde, *Winter*.




Figure 4.4. Jan van de Velde, Skaters from "Little Pasture Songs (*Veld-Deuntjens*)," *Amsterdamsche Pegasus*, 1627.




Figure 4.6. Calendar illustrations from *Groote Comptoir Almanac*, printed by Gillis Joosten Saeghman, 1664.




Figure 4.8. Title page of Jan Joris van der Vliet, *Bredaesche Almanac en Chronijck*, 1664.
